Felly mae'r teulu Jones yn pacio popeth bydd angen arnynt i gefn y car am benwythnos o wersylla ac yn gyrru 40 munud o'u cartref i faes campio Tyddyn Du yn Bont Ddu ger y Bermo.

Lockdown has given us time to consider what is important in our lives. At the top of the list for many is spending more time with family and getting to know those closest to us better.

A window of opportunity opened up during the summer months to escape for an adventure and a family of four from Bala got to enjoy a weekend away together in the beautiful Mawddach estuary near Barmouth in **Antur Adre** (Adventure at Home) on S4C. The series follows friends and families who have chosen to go on holiday closer to home this year to discover some of the wonders Wales has to offer.

The Jones family from Rhosygwalia – mum and dad Dei and Gwennan and two of their children Harri and Elin – were more than ready for an adventure after being stuck in the house for months.

Gwennan said: "We are a family which likes adventure. We like walking in the mountains very much and try to visit the summits of as many Welsh mountains as we can."

Dei, who is a carpenter and very busy running his own business, was keen to spend more time with his family. "I am always working and on the go. I never spend much time with the family, so it's nice just to be able to head off," said Dei.

So, the Joneses pack everything they need for a weekend of camping into the back of their car and drive to the Tyddyn Du campsite in Pont Ddu near Barmouth just 40 minutes from their home.

Harri ac Erin are in charge of choosing the activities for the weekend – so there will be lots of fun as the entire family has a go at abseiling and paddleboarding.

Erin is already a bit of an expert on a paddleboard and Harri has had a go at abseiling before – but how successful with their parents be at reaching the bottom of a huge cliff and keeping their balance on a paddleboard?!

The family also spend time doing more relaxing activities together such as cooking Wagyu steak around the campfire, playing *boules* and watching the sun rise over the Mawddach.

"It was really good to have us all together and trying new things," said Erin at the end of the weekend. "I enjoyed the abseiling best – it was something completely new and it was nice to do it as a family."

Her dad Dei agrees: "What is nice is that the four of us were able to spend time together in the open air, around the fire and having to speak to each other more – more than we would have done at home, perhaps? And it's good to hear what everybody thinks and likes, so, it has worked out really well."

There are more adventures to come in the next few weeks in **Antur Adre**. Three friends go for an adventure to Glasbury on the border between Brecknockshire and Radnorshire while five members of Ammanford Football Club explore the Swansea Valley with the Brecon Beacons National Park providing the backdrop to their activities. The Jones family from Talybont near Aberystwyth – two brothers and a sister – enjoy what Mwnt in Ceredigion has to offer.
